Happy New Year! I greet you in faith, hope, and love this new year. What a blessing to welcome 2024 as a new beginning—a chance to reset, refresh, and renew our commitment to loving God, our neighbors, and ourselves as Jesus taught.

In the Wesleyan/Methodist tradition, we often begin the new year with a covenant service to recommit ourselves to God and remember our baptism when we renounced the spiritual forces of wickedness; the evil powers of this world; sin, evil, injustice, and oppression; and professed faith in Jesus, God, and the Holy Spirit. The service usually includes "A Covenant Prayer in the Wesleyan Tradition" (United Methodist Hymnal, #607) about giving and loving selflessly. It is also about understanding that we are called to a mission and life in service for God's work in the world.

I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

Does this prayer convict you? It does me. I make it a practice to pray at the beginning of every new year and other times throughout the year whether I participate in a covenant service or not. It grounds me in remembering that I am part of something bigger than me and my perspectives. I am invited into a journey where God leads me and others to transform the world through love. I consider it a blessing that I get to be on this journey with each of you and together with God's call and help, and our love in action, we can change the world.

<u>Inspire</u>: Resources to help women of faith deepen our faith and spiritual awareness include the Faith Talks webinars/podcasts and Soul Care retreat models. (Stay tuned for more information about WD UWFaith's Soul Care event this spring—invite a younger lady to attend with you,) Spiritual Growth and Nurturing for Community items from our Reading Program open our minds to how we can nurture ourselves and others.

<u>Influence</u>: Resources to help women of faith further develop their leadership skills within their local organization and beyond include virtual Community Gatherings and monthly previews of that month's chapter of our program book. Reading materials that focus on Leadership Development can be helpful to present and future leaders.

<u>Impact</u>: Resources to help women of faith act boldly through advocacy and service opportunities include the "one click" option to send messages to your congresspeople in Washington D.C. about issues that our organization supports as well as "Ubuntu" opportunities at many UWFaith gatherings, local and beyond. This spring, for example, prior to our Western Jurisdiction event in Anchorage, Alaska (see flyer on p.24), several opportunities to do hands-on service to local

agencies will be available. Reading materials on Education for Mission and Social Action bring insight to our service.

"Praise to God for all His Blessings." I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season. My holiday season was a good and blessed time for me. I was grateful and very fortunate because I was able to go on a 12 day cruise. I was happy and thankful I had this wonderful opportunity to travel to Rome, the Vatican, Athens, the Greek Isles and other exciting places in Europe. In my prayers I thanked God for this opportunity. However, on the eighth day of my cruise I felt ill and started thinking I was catching a cold. In the next 2 days I got worse. I was weak, not able walk. My muscles were sore. I had a temperature and difficulty breathing. My throat was hurting so bad I could not eat, drink or swallow. Daily I was praying to get better, but I continued to get worse. I was wrapped in a blanket to stay warm during the 13 hours flight from Paris to Los Angeles. All during the flight I would wake up in fear and listen to hear voices around me. I would start praying to God because I knew He was hearing my prayers. Then I would doze off again. Grace and mercy was knowing God was with me on the plane. When I arrived in Los Angeles, I immediately went to the hospital for Emergency Care.

God promises to be with us; our God is a promise maker and a promise keeper. I am so thankful to God because I knew He was with me and keeping me in His care until there were other angels to start caring for me.

As United Women in Faith we believe God is with us always in times of joy and times of trouble. Our Faith is grounded in truth. Ten ways to engage the Bible:

- Listen to it: Nehemiah 8:3; Luke 24:27

- Learn to study it: Psalm 119:11, 18, 27.
- Memorize it: Psalm: 37:31; 119:11.
- Meditate on it: Joshua 1:8
- Discuss it: Ephesians 5:19
- Teach it to others: Colossians 3:16
- Pray the Bible: Ephesians 1:15-23, 3:14-21.
- Sing the Bible: Colossians 3:16
- Do the Bible: James 1:22



H.R. 2690 Bill has only been introduced in Congress. It has yet to be passed. To be passed. Purpose: Ending Punitive, Unfair, School-based Harm that is Overt and Unresponsive to Trauma Act of 2023 or the Ending PUSHOUT Act of 2023



This bill requires the Department of Education (ED) to award grants to local educational agencies and nonprofit organizations for the purpose of reducing suspension and expulsion of students (i.e., exclusionary disciplinary practices).

The bill requires ED to collect data on exclusionary discipline in schools.

It also establishes a joint task force to end school pushout.


WELCOME HOME


